



Can I vote in US elections?

It is very important to vote if you are eligible, but voting while not eligible can result in serious immigration consequences. Answer the following questions to find out if you can register to vote.

Do you have a US Birth Certificate, a US Naturalization Certificate, or a US passport?

NO



NO. You cannot vote or register to vote, even if you have a green card or if someone at the RMV or a polling place tells you that you can. If you have done so, please speak to an immigration attorney or legal representative.

YES

Are you over 18 years old?

NO



NO. But you will be eligible to vote on your 18th birthday, and can register earlier in many states.

YES

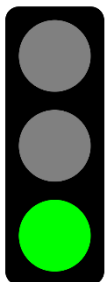
Are you a resident of Puerto Rico, the US Virgin Islands, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, or American Samoa?

YES



YES, BUT ONLY IN LOCAL ELECTIONS. You cannot vote for US president.

NO



YES! You are a US Citizen and can vote in all elections.
